BENCHMARKING: PEP is the Best in Class

In reducing recidivism rates, PEP outperforms all 9 other rehabilitation programs examined. PEP delivers a 380% greater reduction in recidivism than the average of the other programs.

CONTROL GROUP STUDY: No Selection Bias

PEP's graduates are significantly less likely to return to prison than the control group of inmates who were selected for PEP but who did not participate in its programs. This confirms the positive impact of PEP's intervention rather than the influence of its selection process.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT: PEP Delivers Measurable Economic Impact

The extremely high post-release employment and low recidivism of PEP's graduates drive significant savings and benefits (through additional taxes and child support paid, and lower incarceration and social welfare costs). Even without considering the economic impact of the hundreds of businesses created by PEP graduates, the study estimates that every dollar donated to PEP yields a 340% return on that investment.
